## Colorado CD03 Immigration Survey Topline Results

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Magellan Strategies are pleased to present the topline results for a 720n autodial survey of likely general election voters in Colorado Congressional District 3. The interviews were conducted October 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup>, 2013. This survey has a margin of error of +/- 3.65% at the 95 percent confidence interval. This survey was weighted based upon past voter turnout demographics.

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*T1. Are you registered to vote as a Republican, a Democrat or an unaffiliated voter?*

Republican.....	41%

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*T2. How likely are you to vote in the November 2014 general election?*

*T4. As you may know, the House of Representatives is beginning to consider different immigration reform proposals. One option is legislation that would significantly increase border security, block employers from hiring undocumented immigrants, and make sure that undocumented immigrants already in the U.S. with no criminal record register for legal status. If immigrants were to meet a list of requirements, they could eventually apply for citizenship. Knowing this information, would you support or oppose this legislation?*

*While, other members of Congress prefer a bill that would provide a path to citizenship for young immigrants, and would also address the status of other undocumented immigrants by requiring them to pay a penalty, learn English, pass a criminal background check, pay taxes and wait a minimum of thirteen years before becoming eligible for citizenship. 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### **Survey Methodology**

This survey was conducted using automated telephone touchtone technology. The sample used for this survey was randomly drawn from a Colorado CD03 voter file. The survey response data was weighted based upon voting demographics from past Colorado CD03 general election cycles. The interviews were conducted on October 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup>, 2013. Three attempts were made to interview each household in the sample. This survey has a margin of error of 3.65% at the 95 percent confidence interval.

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
